The main **car park** entrance is immediately before the theatre building, on the left







This is **outside the theatre** when you arrive.

This is also the main entrance.



When you **go in the building** you will see this.

This is the BOX OFFICE where you collect your tickets for the show.



This is where you can **wait** until it's show time!

This is also the **entrance** to the performance space where the show will happen.







This is the **venue bar** where you can get a **drink or a snack** if you are thirsty or hungry before the show.



You can meet the actors that are in the play **15 minutes** before the show will start!



This is a picture of the **actors** and the puppet called **Jack Frost**.







You will also meet another **puppet** that is in the show.

This is **inside the theatre** where the show will happen (with no people)

When you go in there may be lots of people there too. You will have your own seat to sit in.



The usher will be handing out hand made snow flakes

The actors will also have these in the show.




In the show, there will be lots and lots of **bubbles**.



The actors will use these to blow bubbles, **they may come into the audience** for you to catch the bubbles.







The **lights will not go off** in the theatre but it may get a little darker. (This picture is an example of what it may be like)

There will also be some bright lights. If it is too bright you can wear tinted glasses or cover your eyes.

You can also move around to a different seat where the lights may be less bright.



When the show starts, you will hear **music and voices.** If it is **too loud** you can cover your ears with your hands or use ear defenders.

Some people may **shout out** or **clap their hands** throughout the show. This is ok. They are showing that they enjoy the play. If you want to you can clap your hands too or choose to be quiet.









If you want to leave the theatre at any point, there is **quiet space** where you can go to relax and play.

There may be other people in those rooms.

There will be some **sensory lights and toys** in the space (as in the photo).

When you are ready you can come back in.

Some of the actors may ask you to join in at times. You can join in if you feel comfortable, or just listen to other people joining in. This is called interacting with the characters.

When the performance has finished, the actors will come out on stage/stand up together. This is called a curtain call. Everyone will clap a lot so the actors know how much they enjoyed the show. Some people will also cheer and make a noise to show that they had a good time.
